Background:

The Postal Regulatory Commission (PRC) held field hearings throughout the summer focused on the potential effects of cutting Saturday mail delivery. As part of this process, the PRC is accepting comments from the public. These comments will play a crucial role in the PRC's recommendation to Congress about whether the Postal Service should maintain mail delivery six days a week.

The NALC knows there are thousands of businesses and organizations, big and small, throughout the country that depend on Saturday mail delivery. The PRC needs to hear from these businesses and organizations before it makes its recommendation to Congress in October. This is why the NALC has launched a Save Saturday Delivery campaign.

The goal of this drive is to get as many businesses and organizations in our communities as possible to sign the attached statement form.
